MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE
STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Held in the State Water Commission Office, June 15, 1944.

A regular meeting of the North Dakota Water Conservation Commission was held in the Water Commission Office, State Capitol, on June 15, 1944. The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Kenneth W. Simons at 10 A.M. with Commissioners Simons, Thompson, Dahl and Orlady; J. J. Walsh, Acting Secretary and Chief Engineer; and Einar Berge present. Governor Moses was absent.

Judge A. M. Christianson came into the meeting at 10:10 A.M. Discussion on the consolidation of the bond issues for various projects. Judge Christianson left the meeting at 10:30.

Commissioner Dahl moved that the April 26 minutes be approved. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Orlady moved that the April and May Financial Reports be approved. Commissioner Dahl seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Orlady moved that the bill of Mr. Means be approved. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Roll call taken with Commissioners Orlady, Thompson, Dahl and Simons voting aye. Motion carried.

The report of the Engineering Sub-Committee was discussed.

Mayor W. K. Taylor, Karl Krueger, C. A. Johnson and Ben Rogelstad of Fessenden came into the meeting at 11:00 A. M. to discuss the water problems of Fessenden. Commissioner Orlady moved that an immediate investigation of the dam be made and that the Secretary check with the Bureau of Reclamation and the Army Engineers as to the possibility of seeing what can be done to get water over that way. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Roll call taken with Commissioners Orlady, Thompson, Dahl and Simons voting aye. Motion carried. Representatives of Fessenden left the meeting at 11:15 A.M.

The report by Mr. Simons relative to the conference with Mr. Maddock re Mutual Aid Corporation Projects will be taken up at the next meeting.

Commissioner Thompson moved that in all cases where water rights were granted to the Water Commission and where the rights are not being used, that the rights be cancelled. Commissioner Dahl seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Meeting recessed at 12:15 P.M. and to reconvene at 1:30 P.M.

Meeting reconvened at 1:40 P.M. Governor Moses, all Commissioners, Mr. Walsh, Einar Berge, Louis Grantier, A. J. Dexter of the Northern Pacific Railway, and Chris Huber of Bismarck were present.

The Water Commission went into executive session. Commissioner Simons moved that Robert Boelter's salary be increased from \$135.00 to \$150.00 per month and that the salary of Roy Tyson be increased from \$185.00 to \$200.00 per month, effective June 1. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Roll call taken with Governor Moses, Commissioners Simons, Orlady, Dahl and Thompson voting aye.

Commissioner Thompson moved that the State Engineer and Acting Secretary, being a member of the Engineering Sub-Committee, be instructed to prepare a letter addressed to all members of the 9 States Committee, to all Governors of the 9 States

committee, to the Senators of the western states of the states involved, to the Manager of the AP, to all dailies of the states interested, to the officers and directors of the North Dakota Reclamation Association, members of the Water Commission and extra copies for more general distribution, the letter to set forth and quote the AP story in order that the story can be compared with the Report. The letter to be accompanied by a copy of the report of the Engineering Sub-Committee. Commissioner Orlady seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mr. A. J. Dexter of the Northern Pacific came into the meeting at 2:15.

Mr. Paul R. Speer of the U.S. Geological Survey came into the meeting at 2:30 relative to stream gaging program for 1944 and 1945. Commissioner Simons moved that the program presented by Mr. Speer between the Water Commission and the U. S. G. S. with reference to stream gaging be approved with the exception of Item #15, Assistance on Fish and Wildlife Program 4 stations on Souris River, the Water Commission's participation to be conditioned on its ability to meet the obligation and with the understanding that if the Commission is able to meet the budget, that we approve the program. Commissioner Orlady seconded the motion. Roll call taken with Commissioners Dahl, Thompson, Simons and Orlady and Governor Moses voting aye. Mr. Speer left the meeting at 2:45 P. M.

The following delegation from Bismarck came into the meeting at 2:45: W. G. Renden, Dr. H. A. Brandes, Henry Jones, Chris Huber and R. L. Melville. Judge Christianson also came into the meeting. Dr. Brandes discussed the matter of the Missouri River cutting away the land on the east bank of the river about five miles south of Bismarck. Judge Sherman of the Board of Administration came into the meeting at 2:50 in the interest of the State of North Dakota which owns land for the Prison Farm in the said vicinity south of Bismarck. Commissioner Simons moved that the Chief Engineer of the Water Commission be instructed to solicit the cooperation of the U.S. Army Engineers in the survey and preparation of a plan to control the river south of Bismarck with the object of protecting the State owned lands on the bottoms south of Bismarck, it appearing that the State of North Dakota is vitally interested through the ownership of a large acreage of land in this territory. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Motion carried. Delegation left the meeting at 3:00 P.M.

Mr. Louis Grantier came into the meeting at 3:05 P. M. Commissioner Dahl moved that the Commission accept a payment of \$300 from Mr. Grantier at this time and that a further settlement be made in the fall. Commissioner Orlady seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mr. Grantier left the meeting at 3:20 P.M. Judge Christianson left the meeting at 3:20 P.M.

Mr. Means report was discussed.

Representation of the Water Commission on the Red River Drainage Basin Interstate Sanitation Committee was discussed and the Commission recommended that Mr. S. W. Thompson be appointed on this Committee. Governor Moses appointed Mr. Thompson on the Committee to represent the State Water Conservation Commission.

Governor Moses left the meeting at 4:10 P.M.

Mr. K. C. Lauster, Acting Director, Division of Sanitary Engineering, came into the meeting at 4:15 P.M. Commissioner Thompson moved that H.R. 4741, a bill "To provide for water pollution control activities in the United States Public Health Service, and for other purposes" be approved in principle and that our Senators and Representatives be notified to that effect. Commissioner Dahl seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Dahl moved that we adjourn at 4:40 P. M. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. Motion carried.
