MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Held in the Office of the State Water Conservation Commission Bismarck, North Dakota, February 7, 1949

A regular meeting of the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission was held in the office of the Water Conservation Commission in the State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota, on February 7, 1949.

MEMBERS OF STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION PRESENT:

OTHERS PRESENT:

Bruce Johnson, Acting District Manager, Bureau of Reclamation, Bismarck W. J. Burke, Regional Counsel, U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, Billings, Mont. Fred J. Fredrickson, Wasnington, D.C. representative for the Commission, Valley City, North Dakota

The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman, S. W. Thompson, at 9:30 o'clock a.m., with the following members of the Water Commission present: S.W. Thompson, Einar H. Dahl, Curtis Olson, J. J. Walsh and Einar Berge, publicity manager for the Commission.

It was moved, by Commissioner Olson, that the minutes of the December 16, 1948 meeting of the State Water Commission be approved as read. Commissioner Dahl seconded this motion, and upon call of the roll the motion carried.

Commissioner Dahl made a motion that the financial statements of the State Water Conservation Commission, for December 1948 and January 1949, be approved and filed in the office of the Commission. Commissioner Olson seconded the motion. Upon call of the roll, all Commissioners present voted aye. Motion carried.

Secretary Walsh informed the members of the Commission that the Missouri Basin Inter-Agency Committee meeting scheduled to be held at Topeka, Kansas on February 17, 1949, had been canceled, due to emergency activities of members on relief work in snow disaster areas of the midwest. The date of the meeting will be announced later.

Commissioner Thompson read a letter from Mr. R. E. Sylvester, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Heart River Irrigation District, enclosing a statement of "out of pocket" expenses which the District has incurred since its organization, and which they submitted to the Commission for approval and payment, as per their agreement at the February 2, 1948 meeting of the State Water Conservation Commission.

Commissioner Olson moved that the Commission approve the payment of "out of pocket expenses" listed on the statement of the Heart River Irrigation District, as of January 26, 1949, which included the following:

postage, payments for directors bonds, supplies, title search and Heart River Irrigation District official Seal, amounting to \$118.91. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dahl. Vice Chairman Thompson called roll, with Commissioners Dahl, Olson and Thompson all voting aye. Motion carried.

A copy of the Re-payment contract between the United States of America and the Heart River Irrigation District was presented to the Commissioners for their files, at this meeting.

Commissioner Thompson read a copy of a letter written by Bruce Johnson, Acting District Manager of the Bureau of Reclamation, and addressed to Mr. Howard L. Corwin, replying to his questions concerning development of the Little Missouri River Basin. Mr. Johnson stated that the Bureau of Reclamation does not, at this time, have a plan for water resources development along that stream, but that funds have been requested to continue the planning and investigation work which is needed before a plan can be worked out.

Secretary Walsh called the Commissioners' attention to the water right applications of those interested in the appropriation of water from the Baldhill Reservoir. Our records show that four of those who have contributed a share of the funds required by the Federal Government, and will be entitled to water from the Baldhill Reservoir, have not yet filed their applications, and that determination of water rights would necessarily be deferred until at such time as these applications will be placed on file with the Commission.

Bruce Johnson, Acting District Director of the Bureau of Reclamation, entered the meeting at 10:00 a.m., in company with W. J. Burke, Regional Counsel, Bureau of Reclamation, Billings, Montana, to discuss the proposed Missouri-Souris Project conservancy bill to be submitted to the North Dakota Legislature. It was agreed to delay further action until a meeting could be neld with the state senators from the proposed district, in the Governor's conference room at 4:30 p.m.

Mr. Fred J. Fredrickson entered the meeting at 10:07 a.m.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 a.m. to reconvene at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon.

Unexpended drainage funds were discussed, and it was the opinion of the members of the Commission that this matter should be placed on the agenda of a later meeting for re-allocation, after reports are received from the Soil Conservation Service engineers and county officers, showing outstanding contracts and amount of funds that will be required for the completion of the projects under contract, or that may be placed under contract prior to July 1, 1949.

Run-off conditions on the Mouse River were discussed, and the Commission was advised of the measures being taken by the Federal Fish and Wildlife Service for the release of water from Lake Darling. Federal engineers have assured this office that the gates of Lake Darling will be opened for the release of water immediately following the completion of the repairs below the outlet structure. Mr. L. G. Hardie, member of the Eaton Flood Irrigation Project, has reported that the gates in the Eaton dam are being cleared of debris and will be opened in time to allow flood waters to flow down the channel.

The Resolution of the North Dakota Reclamation Association adopted at their annual convention held in Dickinson on December 3 and 4, 1948, memoralizing the late Kenneth W. Simons, was read and ordered filed, by the Commission members, with the minutes of the meeting of the Commission.

The application of Mr. Lawrence Fradet, West Fargo, to appropriate and divert water for irrigation purposes, from the Sheyenne River, was discussed by the Commission, and they instructed the Secretary to investigate the proposed irrigation project with Mr. Fradet, at the first opportunity he may have, and report as to its feasibility to the Commission.

With reference to the application of Mr. S. E. Turnbow for the purchase of the Dullam land, members of the Commission have instructed the Secretary to write to Mr. Turnbow advising him the Commission will be pleased to consider his application and to have him submit his bid for purchase of the Dullam land.

Vice Chairman, S. W. Thompson, recommended that any action with reference to the Bismarck Irrigated Gardens be postponed until after Mr. Earle F. Tucker, member of the Water Commission, returns from his vacation.

Members of the State Water Conservation Commission met in executive session in the Governor's conference room at 4:30 p.m. to consider the request of the Greater North Dakota Association, that the State Water Conservation Commission increase their contribution to assist in paying a portion of Mr. Fred J. Fredrickson's salary. After reviewing the work being done by Mr. Fredrickson, both in North Dakota and Washington, D. C., the Commission approved an increase from \$100 per month to \$200 per month, to become effective February 1, 1949.

Commissioner Thompson made the following motion: "I move that the salary of Mr. Fred J. Fredrickson, Executive Director of the North Dakota Resources Board, be increased by the State Water Conservation Commission, from \$100 to \$200 per month, to become effective February 1, 1949." The motion was seconded by Commissioner Olson. Governor Aandahl, as chairman, called the roll, with Commissioners Thompson, Olson, Dahl and Governor Aandahl all voting aye. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 6:00 p.m.
